Craft Supplies Group Buy

At the last meeting, there was a lot of interest in participating in another group buy with Craft Supplies. If you would like to order something, get your information to Duane Hill. Needed information is: your name, item number, page number in the catalog, item description, quantity desired and cost. No money is to be submitted yet, as we will need to factor in the discount. All orders need to be in by November 15 (Craft Supplies new catalog comes out the middle of October. This gives you a little bit of time to see what you need that is new). We need \$1000 in orders to get a 10% discount and free shipping. Our discount goes up as the amount of the order goes up. At present, we have just under \$1000 in orders. Last year, we had over \$5000 in prediscounted orders.

A-Line Machine Tools will once again be having their fall woodworking show on Friday, November 10 (9 AM - 7 PM) and Saturday, November 11 (9 AM - 3 PM). They have asked us again to demonstrate during the woodworking show. This is a great time to show off some talent and to recruit some new members. On Sept 23, Denis Falch, Duane Hill and Art Ustby got together at Denis' shop to check out his McNaughton coring system. Denis had bought the system shortly after the Bill Grumbine demo. Denis was having trouble with the coring system. Duane brought along his tool post for comparison. Prior to getting together, Denis had roughed out two bowl blanks to use. Checking out the system, it looked like Denis was setting his system up wrong. The T-post of the tool post was towards the tail stock instead of towards the head stock and the height of the blade was slightly high. Making these adjustments, we then proceeded to core seven bowls, three each from the two blanks Denis had and another from a cracked blank of oak. We would have got more from the cracked blank, but the cracks were through cracks and pretty sever. All in all, we got Denis' system up and running and had a great time as friends. Total time invested approximately 3 hours, the amount of fun we had - enormous.
