Monthly Tip – If you are having trouble removing your chuck from the lathe, try this. Open the jaws of the chuck to accept a ¾" thick piece of wood about 12" long. Slide the wood between the jaws and lightly close the jaws on the wood. Lock the spindle (or use a Tommy bar to hold it in place). Grab the piece of wood that is in the jaws and rotate it. This should break the chuck free. We have used this method several time at WTC.

<u>We have positions to fill Here at CRW</u>. The elections will be held at the December meeting. We need to elect the four officers per our Chapters By-Laws. Gary Friemann will be staying on as Treasurer.

Duane Hill will be stepping down as Program Coordinator for the chapter.

Jim Frank is the Officer to contact to submit your name for the December election. This is our club and this gives you the chance to get involved in our club. With a Pro turner coming to the November meeting we will not have time to talk about this till December.

President The President shall be the principal executive officer of the chapter his/her duties include:

- A. Supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the chapter.
- B. Conduct at least 6 Chapter meetings per term.

<u>Vice President</u> In the absence of the President or in the event of his/her death, inability, or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the president, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all of the restrictions upon the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

<u>Secretary</u> The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Chapter's meetings in one or more books provided for that purpose and see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws. In genera, the Secretary shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

<u>Treasurer</u> The Treasurer shall collect all membership fees and all other monies belong to the Chapter. He/ She will be responsible for keeping current and accurate records of all monies that flow through the Chapter. In general, the Treasurer shall perform all duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

<u>Program Coordinator</u> Periodically poll club membership to determine what topics will be presented during the upcoming year. Determine what demonstrations will be done and who will demonstrate them. Coordinate and interface with professional demonstrators coming in. Insure all demonstrators have what they need (tools, lathe(s) wood, etc). Plan out monthly meetings several months in advance. Attend Officer meetings. Coordinate outside demonstrations (ie Great River Folk Festival, A-Line, etc).

<u>Tool Czar</u> The Tool Czar has the control over the Chapters Tools, Lathes and Audio and Video equipment. He/She will maintain the tools and control the loaning of the tools and reports to the officers of this Chapter on the state of the Chapters Assets.

To have a club we need members to step up and get involved.

We want to thank the out going Officers for there service, and thanks to Jim

Frank for filling in at Vice President.

Jim Andersen took us through making a hat. This is a interesting process from beginning to end. Jim has done his home work. Great job!






















Hello Fellow Turners.

- 10. Wall Cupboards (2-3" long by 3" high by 1-1/4" deep)

- 12. Foot stools for the two easy chairs
- 13. Pancakes to fit plates
- 14. Window (with Curtains)
- 15. Door with hinges (with door frame)
