

Termination and Turmoil in the AAW

On June 21, 2010 AAW Executive Director Mary Lacer was terminated by the AAW Board of Directors in a 6 to 2 majority vote. Within hours a notice was posted on the AAW website stating she had "stepped down". Board members Malcom Tibbets and Bill Haskell both resigned in protest of the termination. Malcom Tibbets then posted his viewpoint of the situation on the AAW Forum.

The Board's termination of Mary Lacer resulted in a flood of mostly protests from the online community of woodturners who monitor the AAW Forums and other wooturning forums on the internet. 
