President.

The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Chapter. His/ Her duties include: Supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the Chapter; Conduct at least 6 Chapter meetings per term.

Vice President.

In the absence of the President or in the event of his/her death, inability, or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties of President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all of the restrictions upon the President. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Chapter's meetings in one or more books provided for that purpose and see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws. In general, the Secretary shall perform all duties incident to the Position of Club Secretary, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall collect all membership fees and all other monies belonging to the Chapter. He / She will be responsible for keeping current and accurate records of all monies that flow through the Chapter. In general, the Treasurer shall perform all the duties incident to the Position of the Club Treasurer, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President.

Program Chair

The Program Chair will locate and keep a schedule of all demonstration that will be performed at the monthly meetings. Program chair will contact and recommend turners from outside the club and will report to the board. In general, the Program Chair shall perform all the duties incident to the Program Chair, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him/her by the President. If any of you are interested in taking the Intermediate Woodturning course at WTC, now is a great time do it. The class will be held Friday evenings from 6-9 PM and will run for 8 weeks. Currently, there are 5 people signed up. We need 6 to make a class. Class size is limited to 10. Class starts Friday, September 9. If interested, contact WTC's Lifelong Learning Department.

A Segmented Woodturning class will be offered this Winter starting Nov 30th it will run for 8 weeks with a break during the holidays. This will be Wednesdays evening 6pm till 9pm. This class will be on the fundamentals of Segment Woodturning. You will be cutting, and constructing the rings, and stacking them and creating projects. There will be a 3 week safety class to get you certified on shop machines that we will be using in the Segmented class. During this class we will do a Basic Segmented bowl project. 
Items For Sale

Delta Model #46-700 wood lathe with 12" swing and 36" bed. It is equipped with a Reeves drive variable speed system (500-2000 rpm) and is powered by a 3/4 hp motor at 115 volts. Any ordinary outlet will do to fire up the lathe for immediate use. It is in very good condition and sits on a nicely made wooden stand. The only draw back to the lathe is that the purchaser will probably want to buy a second smaller tool rest. This lathe only comes with a 12" tool rest. Most after market tool rests with a 1" diameter post should do just fine. Again, the lathe is in very good condition and would make a wonderful beginner's lathe or a great lathe for a general woodworking shop. I am asking \$395.00 for it. It's worth a trip to my place to check it out.




Next Meeting Onalaska Community Center Saturday, Oct. 15 2011 at 9 am.
