

# The Prez Sez...

Hi

Spent most of the day in the shop. Some days I do better work than others, this was not a good day. One of those days when everything I do is a struggle. I felt like I was back in turning 101. Spent a lot of time working on a 22" spalted maple bowl for a friend - Out side finished and sanded. Inside finished except for that optional last pass for a little more cleanup. Started an easy even shallow cut halfway down the side and across the bottom - I never got to the center. I misjudged the thickness (which turned out to be a strong 5/16") and the bottom blew out along one of the spalt lines. I now have a 22" spalted lampshade. I also have several missing patches of skin on my left arm. I wear a turning smock, glove on left hand and a respirator / visor/ helmet normally when I turn, this outfit is sometimes is hot and confining but saved my face from several orbit bound parts of bowl, the respirator also did something equally important. It kept the bacteria from the maple spalt out of my lungs, wood bacteria loves warm, moist dark places - Lungs- Other than being rather upset at the loss of the project and the embarrassment of explaining to my wife why I was washing off blood in the kitchen sink to get a better look at the damage. I live to turn another day
