Duane Hill is again teaching turning at WTC, and Phil Miller is holding his segmented woodturning class on Saturdays at A-Line. Add to that the occasional foray for lunch to other member's shops to expand horizons, not to mention the snow or cold and it has been challenging to find any time for turning.

Topics to think about at this month's meeting:

Program Director - an active and important position - we are actively seeking a volunteer.

A committee has been set up to deal with the subject of tax free status. They are enlisting the help of a CPA to ascertain pros and cons of our specific club, and will report back so we can make a decision.

I would like to thank Jim and Bob for their presentation on All Things Dust - It could have been very boring but was very good. The tool raffle/tool drawing is in March to coincide with Exotic Blanks demo. We will raffle a \$150 gift certificate for your choice of turning items from the display brought to the meeting from Exotic Blanks. It is going to be a good deal for someone.

The next challenge for April is the good old 2" x 4" x 4' Good for anyone's imagination, skill level, or size of lathe. Talking about a construction stud, do not get excited, we are only talking about wood, Spruce, Hemlock or Fir -not walnut, cherry or yoobangy wood, or an import from the planet Twilow. Cut it, turn it, burn it, spray it, glue it, pound it, and all other options are legal, but the final product must be at least partially turned. You must supply your own material. If you do not have one on hand, for about \$3.50 any lumber yard has an eight-foot piece. That gives you 2 tries or save ½ for a couple years when the challenge will come up again.

Remember this month is the finish of your flute, so bring your pieces and parts. Next month Ed Brown and Exotic Blanks will be turning stone, acrylic, etc and will have a large selection of related turning parts available for purchase.

Now to an important topic - It is annoying but should not have to be, our library is shrinking rapidly each month. More and more members are way over due on their books and DVD's so others do not have them available. If this is not improved, I will improve my popularity and at the beginning of each meeting read off the list of names that are delinquent. I know it does not seem like a big deal, but to those who would like to review the same material it is. The library is the heart of our club, clean up your act people. On that happy note see you Saturday.


