



Also thanks to members who worked the booth and discussed the pieces with interested persons and answered questions. This may seem trivial, but it is important to the success of the overall project.


Fifth, thanks to Clyde for the wood he brought and his assistance to members who turned. Clyde has a great eye for design and teaches well.
