


- >Directions To Shorty's
- >1). Take Highway 35 N to Alma. Continue on 35 N through Alma
- >2). Make a right on Highway 37 (approx. 1.6 miles from Alma Lock and Dam)
- >3). Go approx. 1.8 miles on 37 and make a right on County Road "S"
- >4). Proceed approx. 4.8 miles on "S". Note "S" is very windy and hilly.
- >5). At top op large hill, "S" makes a right, but there is a dirt road going
- >straight (Fire No. 1470). Go onto dirt road. Shorty's

>place is about 1/4 mile down road.




