



January 2018 Fruit Challenge









We are excited to have Mark Palma come back to visit with us about the fine art of embellishment.

Embellishment is the fine line behind beauty and tacky". In this demonstration Mark Palma will discuss various forms of embellishment techniques and tools, as well as some design considerations on where to embellish, when to leave Mother Nature's work alone and when you have gone too far and should toss the mess in the wood stove. Mark will demonstrate some tool techniques using an array of embellishing tools such as the Sorby Tools, the Elf, the Wagner tools, Chatter work, and decorative wire burning. He will also discuss color and texture.

Mark Palma is a member of the Chippewa Valley Woodturning Guild, and the Minnesota Woodturning Association. His woodturning articles have appeared in <u>Woodturning Fundamentals</u>, <u>Woodturning Maga-</u> <u>zine</u>, <u>Woodworker West</u>, <u>Woodworking Crafts</u>, and two AAW publications including one in French.
