

- Cost: \$100 each class includes lunch of sub sandwiches, chips and water.


Class size is limited to 8 people so participants receive adequate instruction.

What is Instagram you ask?

Instagram is a free, online photo-sharing application and social network platform. Instagram allows users to edit and upload photos and short videos through a mobile app. Users can add a caption to each of their posts and use hashtags (#) and location-based geotags to index these posts and make them searchable by other users within the app or web page. Each post by a user appears on their followers' Instagram feeds and can also be viewed by the public when tagged using hashtags or geotags.

What is a hashtag?


Hashtags are words or multi-word phrases preceded by the # symbol, such as #picoftheday or #sweepstakes. People can search for posts with a specific hashtag, so they are used to categorize content and track topics on social media platforms including Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and Pinterest. Using hashtags helps people find posts that interest them.

Fear not if you do not have an Instagram account and do not want to start one you can still view the posts that are made and also see the hashtag photos using the link below. Type or copy the address into your browser and it will bring you to the page. Once there you can use the search feature and search for #crwoodturners to see all the work tagged with that hashtag.
