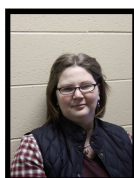

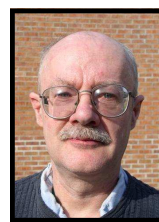

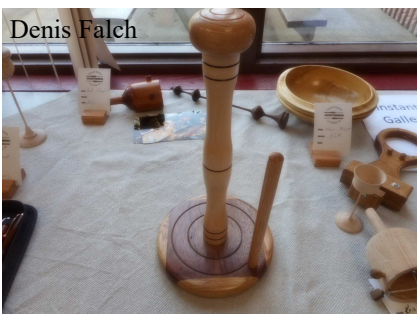

From the Tool Czar

From time to time, turning tools or accessories become available to the tool crib through donation from membership, such is the case with the following tools. Thank you so much. The 2 tools are available for checkout at the July meeting at the clubhouse.



- ½ inch thin skew, traditional shape and grind.
2. Large Sorby teardrop shaped shear scraper, ¾ round shaft.



Tip #5.

From the Safety Corner.

The following is referenced from the AAW's Safety Guidebook for Woodturners. While mainly for new turners, it's a good reminder for veteran turners also. The following basically applies to the traditional tools; skew, gouge, parting tool, etc., with the exception of traditional scrapers. The newer scraper type carbide tools, such as Easy Wood and Woodpecker tools do not follow the ABC's as essentially there is no bevel contacting the wood.

These are the first cuts- ABC's , Anchor – Bevel – Cut

Anchor

Set the tool firmly on the tool rest. The forces of the cut must be taken by the tool rest in as direct a manner as possible. The turner cannot support the downward pressure of the tool with bare hands.

Bevel

Always begin with the handle low, so that the bevel is the first part of the tool steel that contacts the spinning wood.

Cut

Slowly raise the handle until the edge engages that wood and begins to cut a shaving. Keep the handle as low as is possible while still producing a shaving.

Keep it safe my friends.
