

Friends of the wood lathe. I would like to thank Jim Frawley on his presentation on picture frames. We had an interesting and wonderful time at the Stevenson's farm and museum. As always John did an excellent job of showing us with many examples how to make the wonderful frames and rings. It is done in a mixture of segmented turning and an open bowl style. There are pictures in this issue.

We would like to thank the Stevenson's for the years of hosting us for a summer meeting. Steve and Carol have welcomed us always. I am sad to report that this will be our last meeting at their farm/museum. It is a labor of love to get everything ready and to pickup after the club and they are not able to do it anymore. I have learned a lot from being at the farm/museum and witnessing the hosting that they have done welcoming us with open arms. Now that they have extra time I plan on seeing them at more meetings.

This month we have Duane Hill presenting the proper sharpening and use of scrapers. The scraper is a tool that you either use frequently to finish your project taking away tool lines and getting the shape you intended, or it is a tool that you don't quite understand and are probably afraid of. This is the time to see the demonstration and ask all the questions you would like. Duane is a very knowledgeable presenter.

We have been turning Norskedalen this year. I would like to thank John Phillips for coordinating the events this year. Also, a big thank you to all the people that have assisted and demonstrated during the two weekends.

Jim Frank has purchased a new to him chariot and is wanting to park it in the garage. This means a windfall of wood for all of us. He has many bowls that he cut green and dried in alcohol over the years. We will have the bowls and any remaining wood for you to take. We would like you to take a bowl or two, finish them and bring them back for one of the many charities we support. The Vietnam Memorial (Bob Patros), the Empty Bowl (Duane Hill) or the NASA (Jim Frank). Finish the bowl and either contact one of these individuals or bring them to a meeting to help a worthy cause.

This month's challenge is to bring a lidded box. You can also bring in last month's challenge of a candle stick or candle holder.

Look at the updated calendar in this newsletter. We have several interesting programs coming up.




For our June meeting, a small group was able to travel to the Stevenson's near Richland Center. John Frawley presented a demo on segmented picture frames. For John's method, he screws a piece of plywood to a face plate and draws several circles which he uses to center the rings as he flattens them to prepare for gluing together (2). As these layers are all temporary, he uses hot glue to hold them to the plywood. After the layers are glued together (3), John again gets the hot glue gun out and glues the ring stack up to the plywood. After turning the base to accept the mirror (4 and 5)) and a little bit on the inside and outside surfaces at the base, he turns a scrap "bottom" piece (6) to hot glue to the rings and attach a chuck (7). Now John finishes turning the inside and outside (8 and 9). Once the finish is applied, he turns a piece of cardboard to size(10) and holds the mirror and cardboard in place with glazer's points (11). Then he has the finished piece (12).

John also explained that he uses the same method for making a clock frame. He buys a cheap clock (13), removes the frame (14) and turns a deeper grove to fit the clock (15,16, and17). John also demonstrated that he uses a slightly modified version of this method to turn rings(18) and even a taurus (19). He also uses the plywood faceplate to remove tenons from bowls (20).

Following John's demonstration the group ate a lunch of brats and hot dogs with Carol's famous baked beans and other goodies that the club members brought. Several fo the club members and spouses took a personalized tour of the Stevenson museum. In all, it was a great little trip out to the Stevenson's. Thank you to Carol and Steve for hosting us and all the hard work they and a few others did to prepare for the meeting.

I will collect the pieces and would need to get them to Cheryl by July 24. I plan to turn bowls for the event.


Please include your name, type of wood. And, sign your piece.


"A Turn For the Better"
