FOUND IN THE WOOD CHIPS UNDER MY LATHE - from John Griffiths

Hello Members—Just checked under my Jet and sure enough, there were some things worth publicizing laying around.

One important thing - we held a pen turning event on November 21 at Luther HS and a good number of members turned out and helped. We began with about 75 kits, had about five lathes running and taught the kids to make pens. The students were very enjoyable to work with and willing to learn.

There are some kits left over so we are planning to get them finished for donation to Luther, for Mr. Larson to distribute. We will have three lathes going for the regular round robin and a fourth going for pen making as part of the round robin.

So the round robin at the December meeting will be:

- 1, Duane Hill: Thread chasing (and what to do if you happen to catch one).
- 2, Aaron Gesicki: Bowl from a board. (a rather shallow topic)
- 3, James and Julie Bloomer: Turning blanks of Resin. Possibly 3 Dimension printing as well.
- 4, And so (Drum Roll here): Lathe #4 will be Pen Making and perhaps incorporate hands-on for members who want to hone their skills. Using the prepared Luther blanks with the finished pens going to Luther. So - members - if you want, bring along a pen turning tool and safety glasses and satisfy that urge to try making a pen. If you need coaching, this is the time and place. I will already have a mandrel, bushings, pen making live center, EEE polish and assembly board there, and a tool or three as well. Will need some sandpaper, paper towel and friction polish. Mr. Larson has been invited and if he attends, he may want a turn on a lathe to make a pen.


