### From Mark Palma—Points to Ponder in advance

FOR SALE-- 3 lathes (I bought based on the wrong features), 2 grinding systems (that either burn the tools or are too complicated to figure out so I turn with dull tools), 3 chucks (that drive me nuts and the blank flies out of and hits me in the head), 3 dozen tools "guaranteed" to make turning effortless (except for me), and drawers full of jigs, fixtures and accessories gathering dust.

What do we need to be better turners? In this demo we will discuss what we really need to be better turners. It probably isn't one more tool. Mark will show us a series of suggestions on how he has learned (through thousands of mistakes) about some skills, body mechanics, and some tips that make time behind the lathe successful.

Hello members, once again I peeked in the wood chips under my lathe and found these tidbits:

**One:** Our November demo is quickly approaching. Y'all remember we changed it a few years ago to give the Wisconsin deer hunters a chance to both attend the meeting and pursue the "thirty point buck" in some woodlot or unharvested cornfield. The meeting will be the second Saturday this month (only this month). Our demonstrator will be the great demonstrator Mark Palma. He has given us very interesting demos for several years. He sent us information about his demo [see elsewhere in this Newsletter]. He presents with humor, well researched information and an incredible sense of doing it safely. Lord knows we don't want our members keeping the local emergency room busy. The meeting convenes at 9AM Saturday November 10, but come in early to drink coffee, talk smart and help with last minute setup. And some of you stay around to help tear down.




