Wood Turning display at Old Main in Galesville

Members, we are all invited to display our work at the Gallery at Old Main Cultural Center. CRW last displayed there in 2019. Many members had their work on display and it was viewed and admired by concert goers during intermissions. CRW has been asked to do a display again and this is a call for your work. Bowls, platters, vases, hollow forms, boxes, and spindle turned items are all welcome. And you get the honor of having your work on display in a formal gallery setting.

Here is the process: bring your pieces to the March CRW meeting. They should be labeled with a price [if selling], your name and wood species. We may enter items that are not for sale as well. Please include an inventory list so those setting up/tearing down will know what belongs to whom. If an item sells, Old Main will pay you the listed price. No commission or tax will be deducted.

Persons whose work is displayed are offered free admission to Old Main concerts during the display. Members are welcome and encouraged to be present during intermissions to discuss the work displayed and to help handle sales with Old Main staff. Attending allows you to listen to good music in a hall with outstanding acoustics and then schmooze the crowd during intermissions. We do help sell each other's work.
